

Drug Raid Wipes out TCU Football Team

The Texas Christian University football team in Fort Worth lost a few of its star players after a SWAT team conducted a drug raid on campus. One of the players is an All-American linebacker for TCU.

The Chicago Tribune reports that, "four Texas Christian University football players including one All-American were among 17 students arrested Wednesday morning as a result of a six-month investigation into illegal drug dealing on the Fort Worth campus."

Apparently, the investigation is still ongoing and more student arrests are likely at the university, which has an enrollment of 9,500. University officials and Fort Worth cops announced at a news conference on Wednesday.

According to the Chicago Tribune, "the football players arrested were junior linebacker Tanner Brock, junior defensive tackle David "D.J." Yendrey, junior safety Devin Johnson and sophomore offensive tackle Ty Horn."

The TCU football players taken into custody had sold drugs "hand-to-hand" to undercover cops, TCU Police Chief Steve McGee disclosed. Drugs sold to police officers included marijuana, cocaine, ecstasy and a variety of prescription drugs.
