

New Wave of Sex Scandals for KÉC;Pop Stars

The South Korean entertainment industry is marketing KߞPop stars on a global scale, but numerous scandals are emerging that aspiring teenage female singers are being used as sex slaves.

The Korea Times reports that, ÉC;at least 11 singing aspirants were forced to have sex with singers of an entertainment agency in southern Seoul. But the actual number of victims could be much more with the Gangnam Police Station refusing to disclose details of the case.ÉD;

The alleged agency is Open World Entertainment, which a 51-year-old Chang has been operating since 2007 in Cheongdam-dong.

According to the Korea Times, ÉC;the agency announced an apology for the incident last Tuesday after it became public. At first, the police station even rejected to identify the agency on the grounds that victims should be protected.ÉD;

The agency promotes the K-Pops stars, Jun-jin and actor Ko Jwoon.
