

Rush Limbaugh Listeners are "Lunatic Fringe," Says Reuters

The Left-Wing media has begun a wave of blistering attacks against Rush Limbaugh, a popular Conservative radio talk show host. Reuters is describing listeners of his show as "extremists" and members of the "lunatic fringe."

Reuters reports that, "from Lunatic fringe to mainstream.
