

Egypt Demands Obama Arrest Anti-Muslim US Citizens

President Barack Obama is considering whether or not to follow extradition papers submitted by the Egyptian government to arrest U.S. citizens who oppose the rise of Islamic radicalism.

The BBC News reports that, "authorities in Cairo have ordered the arrest of seven U.S.-based Egyptian Coptic Christians for their alleged involvement in an anti-Islam video."

The video posted on YouTube ignited violent demonstrations and riots across the Arab world for its depiction of Prophet Muhammad as a bisexual sex predator.

According to the BBC, "it is unclear who made the film, but it has been linked to an Egyptian Coptic Christian living in the United States."

Egypt has issued an arrest warrant for Pastor Terry Jones, who earned notoriety for burning Korans.
