

'Don't Mess with Texas' Voters, AG Abbott Warns UN

Texas Attorney General Greg Abbott has warned the United Nations that the organization is not permitted to deploy its blue-helmeted troops to monitor polls in the Lone Star State on Election Day.

PJ Media reports that, "Texas Attorney General today advised the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe – a United Nations partner – that groups and individuals from outside the United States do not have jurisdiction to interfere with Texas elections. The Attorney General's letter comes after the international group – comprised of 56 members including EU nations and other countries such as Albania, Azerbaijan, Cyprus, Estonia, Kazakhstan, Latvia, the Russian Federation, Slovenia and Turkey – announced they would be sending election observers to sites throughout the United States, including Texas, on Election Day."

According to Abbott's statement, "elections and election observations are regulated by state law. The Texas Election Code governs anyone who participates in Texas elections – including representatives of the OSCE. The OSCE's representatives are not authorized by Texas law to enter a polling place. It may be a criminal offense for OSCE's representatives to maintain a presence within 100 feet of a polling place's entrance. Failure to comply with these requirements could subject the OSCE's representatives to criminal prosecution for violating state law."
